Prof Miguel Centeno is a multi award-winning teacher and scholar who currently holds three senior positions at Princeton University: Director of the University's International Networks Archive (www.princeton.edu/~ina) which collects network data (e.g. communication, trade, tourism, policy issues, migration) and is a recognised leader in network and globalisation research; Director of the Princeton Institute for International and Regional Studies (www.princeton.edu/~piirs) which is associated with the Woodrow Wilson School of Public and International Affairs and instigates collaborative, interdisciplinary scholarship and teaching on issues of international importance; and Professor of Sociology and International Affairs.

Prof Centeno is the author or editor of nine books including *"Democracy within Reason: Technocratic Revolution in Mexico"* (2nd. 1997), *"Blood and Debt: War and Statemaking in Latin America"* (2002), *"The Other Mirror: Grand Theory and Latin America"*, (2000), and *"Essays in Latin American Military History"* (2005). He is currently working on two book projects: *"Visualizing Globalization"* and *"The Triumph and Dilemmas of Liberalism"*, as well as an online *"Historical Atlas of Globalization"* and a book manuscript based on his course on *"The Western Way of War"*. Through the International Networks Archive Prof Centeno is working on improving the quantitative scholarship available on globalisation.

Prof Centeno obtained his BA, MBA and PhD degrees from Yale University. He has received grants from the Harry Frank Guggenheim Foundation, the National Science Foundation, the National Endowment for the Humanities, and the Woodrow Wilson Foundation. He has been a Fulbright scholar in Russia and Mexico and has also been a Visiting Professor in Buenos Aires and Seoul.

In 1997 Prof Centeno was awarded the Presidential Teaching Prize at Princeton University. In 2005 he was elected to the Sociological Research Association as well as the Comparative Historical Section Council of the ASA.

In 2000, he founded the Princeton University Preparatory Program, which provides intensive supplemental training for lower income students in three local high schools. For this work, Prof Centeno was recently awarded the Jefferson Award for Public Service and the Bonner Foundation Award.
